

What is College Credit Plus?

College Credit Plus allows students to earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking college courses from community colleges or universities. The purpose of this program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and to provide a wide variety of options to college-ready students.

Who is eligible?

Students in grades 7-12 who meet college readiness standards and are accepted into the college or university are *eligible* for the CCP program. Students must complete the entire application process in order to become eligible. This includes being accepted to the University **AND** meeting **individual eligibility requirements for specific courses**.

Students will be held to the exact language stated in ORC 3365.03 regarding Enrollment and Eligibility to participate in the College Credit Plus Program. Madison Local School District will not provide written consent to participate if the student is not compliant with the law in its entirety.

How does my student apply?

Students and Families must notify their school counselor of intent to participate in CCP no later than **April 1**. Students must submit *intent forms yearly*, even if the student participated in the previous school year. Intent forms are located at the end of this packet.

Each university has its own application process to admit students to the CCP program. This includes: submitting an intent form, completing an application, submitting test scores (ACT or ACCUPLACER), and meeting requirements for specific courses. **Students CAN be accepted to the CCP program and not meet requirements for specific classes. It is important that students communicate with the college in terms of eligibility. Applying to the college is the student's responsibility. Students must meet all admission requirements and deadlines of the college and high school.** After acceptance, contact the college to register for classes. Print and submit a copy of the college schedule to your school counselor no later than **May 15**.

How much does College Credit Plus cost?

Public universities cannot charge a student who takes College Credit Plus courses, unless the student fails the course. Private universities may charge a % of tuition.

According to Ohio Revised Code 3365.09 (A), a district may seek reimbursement from a student or parent if a student fails to receive a passing final grade or if the student withdraws from or drops the college course after the 14th calendar day since the course began. However, per Section 3365.09(C) no school shall seek reimbursement if the student is identified as being economically disadvantaged in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code 3333-1-65.6(B)(2).

How do college courses earn students high school credit?

Successful completion of a 3 or more credit-hour college course will equal 1 Carnegie unit earned at the high school. A two credit-hour course will earn students 2/3 of a high school credit and a one credit hour course will result in 1/3 of a high school credit.

Who is responsible for the purchase of textbooks?

Students should check with the Madison library to see if the school already has a copy of the textbook that they are looking for. Should they need to purchase a book, they can pick up a voucher from the college, and the high school will be billed.

Probation and Dismissal

Rule 3333-1-65.13 went into effect starting summer term of 2018-2019 academic year. Students can be placed on probation or dismissed based on being identified as an underperforming student. Please see the worksheet labeled Probation & Dismissal for information on this process.

What happens if my student is deemed underperforming status?

Students that earn a cumulative CCP GPA lower than 2.0 or withdraws from, or receives no credit for, two or more courses in the same term are considered underperforming and will be placed on academic probation. While on probation a student may only enroll in one CCP course. Students may not enroll in the same subject as the college course which the student earned the D or F or no credit. A student may stay on probation for 2 consecutive terms before being at risk for dismissal.

What happens if my student is put on academic probation within the CCP program?

The student may only take one CCP course and must dis-enroll from all other enrolled courses. Failure to do this will result in the student/family paying all the tuition, fees, and textbook costs and be declared ineligible from the CCP program. Students may participate in the CCP program on Probation for two consecutive terms during which time they must raise their cumulative GPA to a 2.0 or higher to be reinstated.

Can I appeal the decision to be dismissed from the CCP Program?

Yes. Students and Parents should refer to the district policy that outlines the student's rights to appeal the decision regarding dismissal from the CCP program.

Reinstatement following dismissal of the CCP Program

Following one term of dismissal, a student may submit a request to the Superintendent to be reinstated to the College Credit Plus Program. Summer shall only be counted as a term if the student is enrolled in one or more high school courses during the summer. Student's full high school and college academic record will be reviewed to determine whether the student has achieved academic progress and whether he/she will be reinstated on probation or without restriction.

The following requirements must be met to be reinstated:

1. To be reinstated on Probation the student must complete high school coursework with a GPA of 3.0 or higher for the term of dismissal.
2. To be reinstated without Restriction the student must complete high school coursework with a GPA of 3.5 or higher for the term of dismissal.

College Credit Plus Excerpt from the High School Registration Book:

Students have the opportunity to earn transcribed college credit while attending high school. This opportunity is available to all students, grades 7-12, who are accepted into institutions of higher education. Students are eligible for 10 Carnegie units/30 credit hours per academic year. Information concerning this program will be available to all students before schedules are made for the following year. **Students who wish to participate in CCP will need to complete a mandatory counseling event to be informed about the program and its updated details yearly. The Madison Comprehensive Counseling Department will host an annual informational meeting that will meet this mandatory requirement for students and their parents/guardians.** Madison Comprehensive High School has also provided access to CCP information, as well as pathways, on the district's website. Letters of intent to participate in the CCP program must be received by the Counseling Department BEFORE April 1st, per the State of Ohio's Legislation. Students are then responsible for applying, collecting and delivering all necessary documentation by the deadlines of the high school and their college of choice.

Testing

Each College/University will have specific eligibility requirements along with processes related to taking the **ACCUPLACER**. Students and their families are encouraged to reach out to the colleges if they have any questions regarding these admission criteria.

Madison Comprehensive High School will not be offering this assessment at the high school.

For students taking Dual Enrollment at the High School

Students must pay close attention to eligibility requirements for dual enrollment courses offered at the high school. **Eligibility requirements are found in the registration book. Eligibility requirements for course work that will be completed AT THE HIGH SCHOOL must be met no later than April 8th, 2022.** Scheduling takes place at the high school during early spring semester and it is imperative that students meet requirements prior to the end of the year to eliminate confusion in August. If you have questions related to your eligibility and wish to retest, it is the student's responsibility to communicate with the college in order to ensure the required scores on the Accuplacer or ACT by the testing deadline.

****Note: You can be accepted into North Central State College's CCP Program and be eligible for some classes and not others. It is important that you verify your eligibility for specific courses directly with the college.**

***Please note: It is the student/family's responsibility to verify eligibility for college coursework. It is possible to be admitted to the CCP program and NOT be eligible for certain courses.**

 - **Student will be notified of Admission via email** once CCP Eligibility and all supplemental documents are received by NCSC

The Ohio State University Academy / College Credit Plus Program

About the Academy Program

The Ohio State Academy Program is an opportunity for outstanding high school students to enroll in Ohio State classes. The Academy Program is the Ohio State implementation of the College Credit Plus program that has been created by the State of Ohio. This program is a partnership between Ohio State, the high school, the student in addition to his or her parent(s)/guardian(s).

Academy Options

College Credit Plus (most common): Students enroll in courses to receive college credit and high school credit; the local school district is responsible for the cost of tuition and textbooks for the student. A student can complete College Credit Plus in the autumn and spring semesters, as well as summer term.

Self-Pay Option: Students who do not have funding through the state or who do not want college course work to appear on the high school transcript enroll in college credit only classes; the students' family is responsible for all costs. This option is also available for the autumn and spring semesters, as well as summer term.

Important Note: Students who attend a non-public high school or are home schooled must apply to the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) for funding once they have been admitted to the College Credit Plus program. For more information, contact your high school counselor or principal, or visit the ODE website at education.ohio.gov.

The Ohio State Academy is designed for students who have achieved at the highest levels while in high school. Admission to the Academy will be based upon a student's college readiness as measured by standardized test scores (ACT, SAT, or Accuplacer). The majority of students who enroll in the Academy are in the 11th or 12th grade. However, the program is open to exceptional students in grades 7-12; these students must meet the same admissions requirements as the older students.

Application Deadlines

Public School Students:

- Autumn semester (begins in August): Apply by May 1
- Spring semester (begins in January): Apply by October 15
- Summer term (begins in May): Apply by February 15

Non-Public School Students:

- All semesters (begins in August): March 1
 - Additional steps to be completed before June 13:
 - Apply for funding from the State of Ohio Feb 3-May 1 at 5:00PM
 - Upload an admissions letter from Ohio State to your OHID Account
 - Email Ohio Department of Education funding letter to Ohio State by June 13

Note: The funding application for the State of Ohio used by Non-Public school students is not affiliated with The Ohio State University. If you need assistance with the State of Ohio Funding Application for Non-Public school students, call the helpline at 877-644-6338.

Non-Public students participating in the program as self-pay (paying out of pocket instead of through funding from Ohio) can adhere to the public-school deadlines for each semester.

Application Process

1. **Online Application:** create account and log in to complete the application. Navigate by clicking on the tabs at the top. You will receive an email confirmation once your application is submitted.
2. **High School Information Form** completed by your high school guidance department. You request they send it.
3. **Official transcripts** from high school and other ccp course work at other institutions (7th and 8th grade students can submit middle school grades, high school students must submit high school transcripts) You request they send it.
4. **College Readiness Assessments.** Regional Campus students can submit ACT, SAT or Accuplacer scores.

Admissions Criteria

Requirements: To determine college-readiness, Ohio State will look at a student's curriculum and standardized test scores or Accuplacer scores to see if they meet the state of Ohio's Remediation Free Guidelines.

Who should participate in the Academy program?

Because students in the Ohio State Academy Program will be taking classes on campus and in classrooms with older students, it's important for families to discuss if this is the right option. Students will have a college transcript and grade point average that will follow them after participation in the program. We recommend that students who participate are:

- Motivated and mature, able to advocate for themselves and able to follow through on required work;
- Strong academic students, ready to take on the challenge of more difficult work and faster pace;
- Willing to devote extra time for the program, and possibly give up current extra-curricular activities.

****Admission to the Academy does not imply or guarantee admission to the Columbus campus as a degree-seeking student after high school graduation****

Course Registration

Students who are admitted to the Academy Program will be invited to an orientation program shortly before the start of their first semester of enrollment. Students will meet with the Academy advisor and schedule classes after placement testing and orientation is completed. You will need to check your OSU email frequently after accepting admission for info about orientation, placement testing and scheduling.

Course enrollment may be limited by the academic departments' prerequisites. Also, course enrollment will be limited by the number of seats available in the course. Current Ohio State students who are pursuing their Ohio State degree will be offered first choice of courses before Academy students are able to register for classes.

Accuplacer

If a student does not meet the Ohio's Remediation-Free Guidelines or is not taking the ACT/SAT, the Accuplacer will be used to determine admissions eligibility. Please note that we cannot accept Accuplacer scores from another institution or high school. The Accuplacer test needs to be proctored by Ohio State for the scores to be used for admission into the CCP Program at OSU. To register for the test, go to go.osu.edu/mansccp and click "Accuplacer Registration." You cannot take the Accuplacer until you have submitted your application and your application documents are sent to Ohio State.

STEPS TO PARTICIPATION

1. Submit the Letter of Intent before APRIL 1st

- a. Submit the Letter of Intent to your school counselor if you are a public school student.
- b. Home-schooled and non-public school students must apply for funding. Please see the ODE website for deadlines and instructions, www.ohiohighered.org/ccp/students-families. You must submit a copy of your award letter to AU before you can register for classes.
- c. Accepted students do not need to reapply to AU's CCP program each year, but they do need to submit the Letter of Intent EACH year.

2. Apply to AU before MAY 15th - <https://apply.ashland.edu/apply/>

- a. Click on "Create an account" under "FIRST-TIME USERS". Within the app, choose CCP as the app type.
- b. Be sure to use YOUR PERSONAL EMAIL ADDRESS when applying, NOT YOUR HIGH SCHOOL EMAIL ADDRESS. Many schools' network settings block messages from outside parties; as a result, you may never receive your acceptance letter with registration instructions if you enter your high school email address.
- c. If you haven't heard from us in 2-3 weeks, please contact us at collegetcreditplus@ashland.edu, as we are likely missing information necessary to make a decision. Please double-check that your acceptance letter did not go to your spam folder.

3. Ask your school counselor to send us a copy of your transcript.

- a. Your counselor will not know to send it unless you ask him/her to do so.
- b. Counselors may send transcripts to au-transcripts@ashland.edu.

4. Register for Classes

- a. ALL CCP students will receive instructions in their acceptance letter on how to set up their AU accounts and register for classes.
- b. Students who take courses at the main campus or online will work with AU's enrollment coordinator to create their schedule. Please watch your email for instructions and contact us at collegetcreditplus@ashland.edu if you have questions or concerns.
- c. Students who take courses at their high school (or who take online courses that have been arranged by their high school) simply need to notify their school counselor as to which courses they want to take. School counselors will then send us a copy of their rosters so we know who to register..

Can I participate?

Students must be Ohio residents to participate. Students must meet the State's eligibility requirements, as well as the admission requirements of each college to which they apply. Please see AU's admission requirements on page 3.

What courses can I take?

Until students complete 15 credit hours in coursework, they must choose from a list of Level One courses. Each college will have its own level one list. Turn to page 5 for AU's complete list.

Where can I take classes?

Courses are available at the AU main campus, online and at select partnering high schools.

Am I limited to the CCP courses offered at my high school?

No. If your high school does not offer CCP courses which interest you, you are not restricted to those courses. You may take courses from any combination of locations (at your high school, AU main campus or online) that fit into your schedule as long as you do not exceed the 30-hour per year limit.

Is it really free? What about textbooks?

Yes! There are no tuition charges for AU courses when they are part of the CCP program. AU waives all course and lab fees. The student/family is responsible for transportation.

Public school students' textbooks are paid for by their school district. Most students who take courses on main campus will get their books from the AU Campus Store; however, please check with your guidance counselor about your school's individual textbook policy. Home school students must purchase their own textbooks.
