**Intent of Federal Funds for 2022-2023**

**Title I, Part A** – current year amount \$767,419.85

- 54.41% or higher free/reduced lunch eligibility.
- Madison Local is a Title I school wide district.
- Tiered system of funding to document funds are directed to the greatest areas of need.
- Expenditures must be supplemental to the standard program and must be spent to achieve goals set forth in the District improvement plan (based on a comprehensive needs assessment).
- The purpose of Title I funds is to provide all children significant opportunities to receive a fair, equitable, high-quality education, and close the educational achievement gaps.
- 1% of the grant is reserved for Parent Engagement activities.

Common uses of funds include: additional staff, supplemental tutoring, supplemental instructional materials, and parental engagement activities.

**Title II** – current year amount \$109,548.57

- Funds must be used to improve student achievement by improving teaching and leadership (teacher and administrative staff development).
- Funds are also used to reduce class sizes through the recruiting and hiring of additional effective teachers.
- In-service training for school personnel for referral and partnerships between school and school-based mental health programs, and improving conditions for student learning such as safety, peer interaction, drug and alcohol abuse, and chronic absenteeism.

Madison Local School District uses Title II funds for the following: supplemental staff to support instructional coaching, district-level professional development geared toward implementing the content area curriculum, leadership development, and classroom size reduction.

**Title III** – current year amount \$488.07

- Funds must be used to help students who are identified as Limited English Proficient English. (Advanced proficiency expected within 3 years) while at the same time mastering state content area standards.
- Funds must be supplemental to what is required by State law, and supplemental to all other federal funds as well.
- Only 2% may be used for administrative costs.

Madison Local uses Title III funds for supplemental instructional materials and technology for teachers.

**Title IV** – Current year amount \$74,109.01

- 20% well-rounded educational opportunities, 20% safe and healthy students' activities, supporting effective use of technology (15% limit on infrastructure).

Madison Local uses Title IV funds to develop and support innovative programs and professional development in STEM. Title IV provides professional development and coaching for leadership, and academic interventions. In addition, Title IV supports the school safety program.

**IDEA B** (Special Education) – current year total \$789541.26

- Personnel, contracted services, supplies, materials and equipment (including technology) to benefit K-12 students with disabilities

**IDEA B PK** (SPED) – current year total \$17,758.79

- Personnel and supplies/materials (including technology and software) to benefit students with disabilities ages 4 and under.

**Carl Perkins** (Career Tech) - \$54483.13

- Technology and materials for upgrading programs for career paths and college readiness at Madison Comprehensive High School. Skills assessments and career coaching with each student helps to determine which program the students would like to explore.

**Carl Perkins** (Adult) - \$70,427.33

- In an effort to retain qualified instructors and administrators, professional development activities and training for its instructional and administrative employees, MACC (Madison Adult Career Center) promotes professional development opportunities through ODHE and our Ohio Technical Center's PACE Organization and encourages instructional and administrative staff to attend.

**Private Non-Profit Schools**

Private non-profit schools may be eligible to receive services under federal funds. Currently, St. Mary of the Snow Catholic School and Mansfield Christian School participate in Title I, II, IV, and SPED. St. Peter's Catholic School participates in Title I (not eligible for others due to being located outside of our boundaries). Consultations with private, non-profit schools are held on an ongoing basis.
