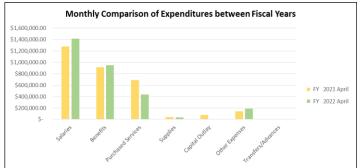


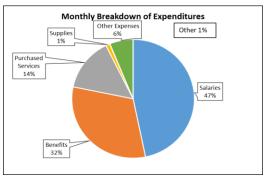
In April the district's expenditures exceeded revenues by about \$181,000. The Property Tax revenues were down in April but that is a result of timing of when the district received advances from the County for Property Tax collections. Overall Real Estate revenues are about 1% above the fiscal year-to-date revenues from this point in time last year which is the result of a \$5.3M increase in assessed valuations over last year. This being the case, the large decrease in Revenues comparing April of last year to April of this year is significantly influenced by timing of receipts.

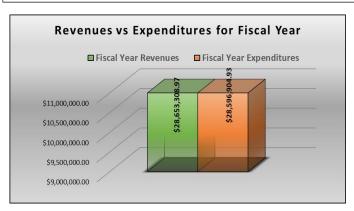
The district's State Foundation adjustments for the month of April in tuition deductions for students housed in a residential facility, which isn't an adjustment that occurs regularly was an adjustment that occurred this April and didn't occur last April so that is another result of timing.

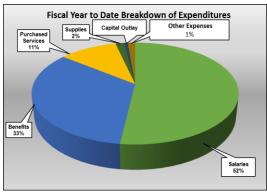

For the month of April the districts expenditures were about 4% below last April. The biggest decreases in April's expenditures over April of last year were in Purchased Services and Capital Outlay. The fiscal year-to-date expenditures are around \$56,000 below the fiscal year-to date revenues which means the district expenditures and revenues are essentially balanced for the fiscal year so far. The fiscal year-to-date the decreases in expenditures of Purchased Services are what is driving the overall decrease in expenditures. The increase in Salaries in April can be explained by the ratification of a contract in April resulting in retroactive payments and salary increases and the increases in Benefits are partially a result of the salary increases and insurance increases.

The end of April was 83% through the Fiscal Year and the district's fiscal year expendatures are at 84% of what is Forecasted so the district is on target for the year and comparable to the previous fiscal year.

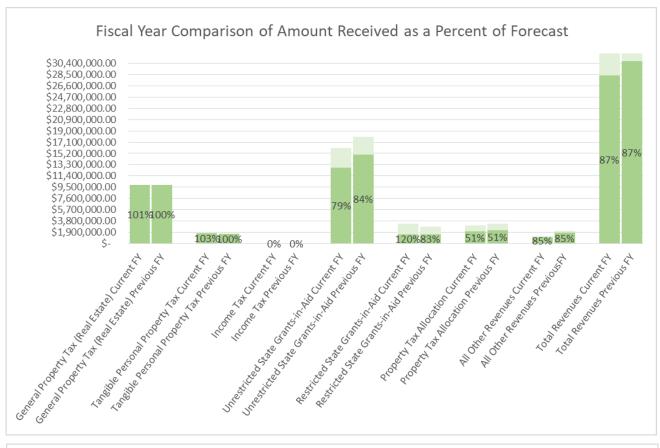

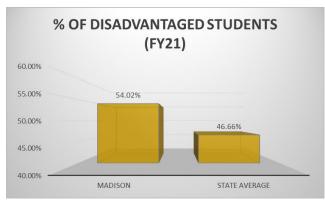
Revenues and Expenditures as a Percentage of Forecasted Amount for Current Fiscal Year

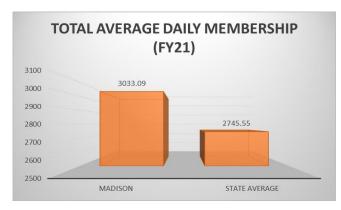


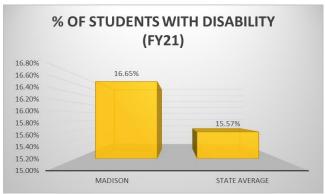


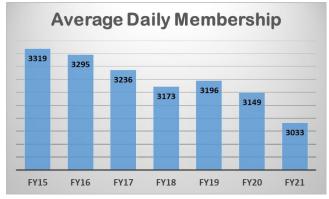
